



## Activity 1

<b>Name of the activity</b>	<b>Green Communication Icebreaker</b>
<b>Topic Covered</b>	Introduction to effective communication for green practices
<b>Learning Outcomes and Competences that can be acquired</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Understand the importance of effective communication in promoting green practices.</li><li>• Recognise the key principles of effective green communication.</li></ul>
<b>Duration</b>	15-20 minutes
<b>Kind of Method</b>	Icebreaker activity
<b>Required Materials</b>	Small cards or sticky notes. Markers.
<b>Learning Setting and Activity Description</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Briefly introduce the concept of effective communication for green practices, using the key points from the module.</li><li>2. Distribute small cards or sticky notes to each participant.</li><li>3. Ask the participants to write down or draw one thing that they think is important for effective green communication. This can be a word, a concept or a picture.</li><li>4. Participants take turns sharing their cards with the group.</li><li>5. Ask participants to briefly explain why they have chosen a particular aspect of effective green communication.</li><li>6. Facilitate a short discussion about the shared ideas.</li><li>7. Emphasise the diversity of perspectives and the importance of different elements in green communication.</li></ol>





<b>Activity Evaluation/ Reflection</b>	Ask participants to reflect on how their understanding of effective communication for green practices has developed during this short activity.
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
